He has spent most of his working life as a freelance in the arts, music and media sectors, editing and producing for broadcast television, arts and corporate sectors while developing an internationally acknowledged personal practice in creative media arts and dance on screen.

After completing a Biology degree, Simon spent time working in the music industry before going on to gain a media arts post-graduate diploma at DJCAD, Dundee University. More recently he gained an MSc degree with distinction in Sustainable Development through the University of the Highlands and Islands.
